Family Recovery Center is dedicated to providing high quality, cost effective, holistic services for the entire family addressing chemical addiction, mental health disorders, safe housing and other health care needs to promote community wellness.

Family Recovery Center is a private, non-profit outpatient treatment center for substance abuse and/or mental health issues for residents of Columbiana County and neighboring jurisdictions. Historical highlights of the Center are:

- 1973—Center was established for community outreach
- 1974—The Outpatient Counseling Department was established
- 1980—The Education Department was established
- 1985—Steering Clear, a 72 hour driver intervention program, was created
- 1993- the WomanFocus program, a gender specific program with intensive outpatient counseling, case management and aftercare services.
- 1990s—Intensive outpatient programs were begun for clients referred by the court system for substance abuse and for domestic violence.
- 1995—An Oxford House was deeded to the Center to provide a drug-free environment for recovering men
- 2002—Fleming House, transitional housing for women and children, was constructed. The first residents moved in in 2002.
- 2008—Hearthside Program was launched to provide affordable housing for clients with a disability.

Family Recovery Center enjoys good working relationships with the numerous agencies and institutions in the county, enabling it to provide a comprehensive team approach to meet the needs of its customers.

Fleming House



What is it?

Located in historic Lisbon, Ohio, Fleming House provides safe, affordable, drug-free transitional housing and specialized services for homeless, chemically dependent women and their children. There are ten furnished apartments, a large community room, a multipurpose room with kitchenette, laundry facilities and access to children's daycare.

Fleming House was named for Luceille Fleming, the former Director of the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services and a strong proponent of women's treatment in Ohio for over a decade.

Who Can Live There?

Potential residents of Fleming House must meet the following criteria to be eligible for consideration:

- Woman with a substance abuse/dependency problem who is 18 years or older and able to take care of herself and her children (when children are staying with the mother)
- Be committed to long-term recovery from addiction
- Be willing to seek education and/or employment that will lead to an independent lifestyle within two years
- Homeless—not having a proper place to sleep at night, at imminent risk of homelessness, or fleeing domestic violence
- Meet the Federal poverty guidelines
- Applicants and their children should be in good health and, if on medication for physical and/or mental health problems, the woman must be willing to maintain any treatment that is necessary for herself and her children.

Facts for Fleming House Residents

- Rent will be set at 30% of the family's income. Income will be reviewed, once stabilized, and then annually
- A deposit of \$350 is required. If the apartment is in good condition at move out, all or a portion of the money will be refunded to the source at time of departure
- A resident will participate in all activities as determined by her case manager and herself.

Fleming House Activities

- Intensive case management to link individuals to vocational, educational, recreational, and other community resources
- Individual and group counseling to address such issues as anger management and relationships
- Team collaboration with other community agencies with which the family is involved.
- Mentoring activities with other recovering women and involvement with 12-Step activities
- Life skills training in areas such as money management, legal issues, parenting and nutrition
- House meetings and social events with and without the children
- Access to childcare for working mothers



How to Apply

and request an application for Fleming House. Upon receipt of the application, a staff member will contact the applicant to set up an initial interview.

Referring agencies should call Family Recovery Center and request a supply of applications to have on hand for their qualified clients.

Potential residents for Fleming House are evaluated on a case-by-case basis; preference may be given to those who have successfully completed a primary treatment program and/or maintained a period of 3 months of sobriety with self-help involvement.

The interview process with the woman and her children may take 2-3 sessions and she may be asked to complete several assigned tasks before a decision about residency is reached. Any agencies with which the family is involved will be contacted to get a complete picture of what is happening with her family.
