A support network

Long-term sobriety requires ongoing treatment and a safe environment. Family Recovery Center will provide continued care and support through a powerful, convenient program that helps the client learn to fully integrate recovery in their day-to-day lifestyle. Our Substance Abuse Treatment (SATP) program includes an intense group environment that meets once a week for two hours in accordance with specifications set by the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (OhioMHAS). Clients participate in treatment through active discussions, completing homework, and identifying faulty thinking patterns and self-defeating behaviors. Groups are small and generally do not exceed 10 people.

Program components

- An individual, comprehensive assessment/evaluation
- Individual, group and family therapy
- Flexible scheduling over the 10-week program
- Individualized treatment and treatment goals
- Medication assisted treatment is available
- Family involvement is emphasized and encouraged

Skills learned

- Managing urges and cravings
- Understanding the brain chemistry of addiction and the process of recovery
- Intro to the 12-step program and the benefits of having a sponsor.
- Accepting and acting on feedback
- Practicing effective communication
- Developing coping skills and finding ways to reduce stress
- Identifying anger triggers and

While participating in the Substance Abuse Treatment program, clients can still go to work, get an education, and begin rebuilding their lives with the support and help they receive from the program. They can immediately apply the lessons they have learned to their lives.

- Identifying relapse triggers and warning signs and developing practical and realistic plans for avoiding them or distracting attention away from them

Eligibility

Eligibility for SATP is determined by a mandatory clinical/medical assessment, which is conducted as part of the admission process. Fees are assessed on a sliding scale, and Medicaid and most insurances are accepted.
